Reflection: INCARNATION OF JESUS AND IMAGE OF GOD

Colossians 1:16-17

A famous theologian Kwok Pui Lan observes that recent ecological crisis is a result of breaking down of a great chain that connects human beings, all sentient things and nature. In other words, ecological crisis has resulted from a loss sense of interconnectedness and interdependence of creation. Human beings have forgotten that they are intrinsically connected to the wider created order for survival. Hence there is an urgent need to re-establish covenant with land, oceans, forests, rivers and mountains. Western Christian theology and world view had projected God as a distant God who rules the earth from a distance. He once entered the world by becoming a servant in the form of a human being and through resurrection went back to glory. This resulted in the dualism between God and nature. Consequently, image of God was taken away from the world and placed God at a considerable distance from created order. Such an approach which projects God as a distant reality should be reinterpreted and incarnation of Jesus Christ becomes a tool to reinterpret both the transcendence and the immanence of God.

The text makes it clear to us that through incarnation lesus assumes God's role as creator and sustainer. All things were made through him, and without him was not anything made. (John 1:3). Everything was created in him, through him and for him and everything is held

together in him (Col 1:16-17). This view of incarnation makes visible to us that God is present in cosmos and cosmos is present in God. God and cosmos are not separated or closed; they are open to one another. God is first present in universe and then in human beings. In the words of Samuel Rayan "The earth comes to complete truth in Jesus Christ. In him the earth does become the face of God and the place of saving encounter. In Jesus the earth becomes supremely honored, seated at the right hand of God." In Jesus the mystery of God has been manifested and Incarnation is the display of these mysteries. The text of Colossians shows us that Incarnation was already present at the beginning of universe, thus the Son was always the part of evolutionary process. Therefore, the Christ of faith is the head of cosmos and the meeting point of all beings. Thus Christ is ever present in evolution; he is its liberator the one who brings it to fulfillment. Incarnation reveals to us the cosmic image of Christ which is in harmony with created order. This cosmic image of Christ signifies the supreme glorification of God. Seeing the image of god through created order does not confuse world with God, yet it is a place where God is present to us and close to us. It helps us to see creator in creation and relate to it is a more significant way.

NCCI Scholarships

Eligibility

- Candidates should belong to one of the Member Churches of the National Council of Churches in India.
- Should be in the age group of 25-35 years.
- Should be committed and willing to utilize their service and expertise in their respective Church or Ecumenical organizations.
- Confirmed admission in any college/university/institution (copy of admission letter must be attached along with application forms).
- Willingness to undertake an assigned project work from NCCI on the field of study.
- Candidates should belong to economically weaker section and should produce a certificate of source of income.
- Preference given to candidates from rural areas, Youth, Dalits, Tribals, Women and immediate migrants.
- Applications should be endorsed by the Heads (Diocese/Conference/Synod/Convention).

Restrictions

Scholarships are not awarded for:

- Studies in abroad/foreign countries
- Under Graduate or Graduate Studies or Doctoral studies (Ph.D/D.Th.)
- For a family (scholarship for spouse and children).
- Study duration less than 3 months or more than 2 years.

Scope of Scholarship

The scholarships are minimal and are only incentives for doing special studies and research in specified fields. Fifty percent of scholarships are ear-marked for women candidates. The proposed areas of studies must be ecumenical in nature.

Application Procedure

Download the application forms from the NCCI website (www.nccindia.in). Candidates should send the filled in application forms with relevant documents attached to NCCI office for screening and evaluation.

15 Frightening Facts About Our Environment That Show Why Our Planet Earth Is Dying

- #1. Pollution is one of the biggest global killers, affecting over 100 million people. That's comparable to global diseases like malaria and HIV.
- #2. More than I million species have already faced extinction due to global warming. One Million. And a considerable number is under threat.
- #3. Also, thanks to global warming, studies reveal that by the end of the century, around 1,50,000 people will have died of heat related causes.
- #4. And, in spite of all the startling consequences, the amount of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere has risen by 34% since the 17th century. And it continues to rise steadily and alarmingly.
- #5. The human population on Earth has grown as much in the last 50 years as in the past four million years.
- #6. We are using up 50% more natural resources than the Earth can provide. At our current population, we need 1.5 Earths.
- #7. Rainforests have taken thousands of years to form but every second a portion the size of a football field is destroyed.
- #8. One and a half acres of forest is cut down every second.
- #9. Thanks to the tremendous amount of reckless waste disposal, we have a garbage island floating in our ocean, mostly comprised of plastics the size of India, Europe and Mexico combined!
- #10. According to USAID, one-third people of the earth will be facing "severe" or "chronic" water shortages by the year 2025.
- #11. Water pollution has gripped the planet miserably. According to the World Health Organisation, 3.2 million children under the age of five in developing nations die each year as a result of unsafe drinking water and poor sanitation.
- #12. In India, the scenario is gloomy as well. It has been estimated that 75% of all surface water in India has been heavily contaminated by human or agricultural waste.
- #13. It is estimated that approximately 40% of the children living in Africa and India have had their growth stunted due to unclean water and malnutrition.
- #14. According to a UN study on sanitation, far more people in India have access to a cell phone than to a toilet.
- #15. Plastic bags and other plastic garbage thrown into the ocean kill as many as 1,000,000 sea creatures every year.
