International Prayer Day for Peace in India (21st September 2018) Peace Sunday (23rd September 2018)

Theme: Right to Peace: Celebrate... Affirm... Defend... Promote...

Dear Fellow Pilgrims in the Faith Journey of Justice and Peace,

Our God, who is Life and Peace and who loved the World, has sent the Prince of Peace to 'Celebrate', 'Affirm', 'Defend' and 'Promote' Peace on Earth.

Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace said to the apostles, "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you". This gives us courage to challenge the perpetrators of violence and to change their behavior on Earth.

God has used the United Nations Organizations to publish the Universal Declaration of the Human Rights (UDHR) as a gift for us to use and to uphold social justice based on the gospel values of Justice, Love and Peace. This year, the United Nations in celebrating and commemorating the 70th year anniversary of UDHR, by inviting the global communities to celebrate International Peace Day (21st September 2018). Alternately we could observe 26th September 2018 as Peace Sunday.

Joining hands with the UNO, the World Council of Churches calls global faith communities to observe the International Prayer Day for Peace. The World Council of Churches proposes that we observe a Week Prayer for Peace from 16th September to 23rd September 2018, especially remembering the peace-less context in the birth place of the Prince of Peace. The National Council of Churches in India joins the World Council of Churches in observing the International Prayer Day for Peace, particularly praying for peace in India as well as for peace in Palestine. Therefore, a worship resource has been prepared for you in this regard.
