I bring greetings in the name of our resurrected Lord Jesus Christ with a living word of God Isaiah 41:10 – “So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.” We are in a time of global health crisis. The world is in fear and anxiety. COVID 19 has created havoc and disaster in the lives of human beings all over the world. We are witnessing such situation first time in our lifetime. It seems our fight against the virus has just begun and we have to go a long way. We are under lockdown, life and human movements have come to standstill. The gap between the rich and poor is more visible than ever before even though the disease is not discriminatory, yet the poor people, low wage workers, domestic workers, migrant labours who suffer the most because of lockdown and isolation. It is commendable that the government agencies and NGOs, churches are reaching out to these people. But the need is enormous and we need to prepare for a long term engagement. JELC during the lockdown is having hardest time. Our congregational believers are deprived of the

spiritual nourishment. Online prayers are being organized every Sunday, but this facility is limited to few congregations only. First time in history, we had to be at home on Good Friday and Easter Sunday and even missed part taking in Holy Communion. Most of our pastors in the rural congregations are not getting their salaries as there is no offering being collected. It is not just a mere health and economic challenge, but a deep spiritual challenge as well. To be at home in isolation without much social contacts is not an easy life and many may go into depression. Therefore, we are also keen in providing pastoral care and counselling during this critical time. We have started distributing food, ration to the neediest people who have lost their income and means of livelihood. Our congregations are raising resources to help the poor people. The lockdown may have another dimension for us to reflect on how we have become more concerned for our brothers and sisters in need, our time for family are more intense and meaningful and the earth is pollution free. Though we badly look forward to start life like before, yet, the present situation has indeed taught us new way of looking at life. We Our Partnership Desk is much engaged in making communications easy and possible on social media by putting up a lot of information and thus the church is reaching quite a number of people. I pray to God to give all of us the hope and strength in a time such as this so that we all remain in prayer and stay healthy. [May God bless you all!](#)
